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What is environmental justice?

- No group of people—for example, indigenous communities—should disproportionately bear the environmental and health burdens of industrial activities (distributive justice)
- Affected communities should be meaningfully involved in decision-making processes (**procedural justice**)

Key questions

- What does meaningful involvement in decision-making mean?
- What are some of the barriers to meaningful involvement that communities often face?

Ensuring that the community—not the project developer—sets the agenda and terms of community engagement
